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
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
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

Car week "Monterey" hit the area in full stride with gatherings of Ferraris, Lamborghinis, Duesenberg's, and every type of modern concept ar you can imagine. The local community benefited immensely with the large influx of big spenders to the area. Approximately \$463 million in vehicle sales were made during the span of a few days. A 1955 Ferrari 410 Sport Spider hit the auction hammer at \$22 Million!

In addition to expense Ferraris the 2nd Annual Monterey Convoy took place on August 18th was a big hit for all that participated. The convoy made its way around the Monterey Peninsula and wound up in the parking lot of Employnet, Inc. where tacos and beer completed the event. A great time for all involved. In addition, the annual pilgrimage to Reno NV occurred to witness the Worlds Fastest Motorsport, air racing. If you are into historic aircraft and aviation, then this is the event to take in. The event is divided into five racing classes which include aircraft with 100 HP engines to the mighty Sea Furies with 28 cylinders and 4300 horsepower.

The heavily modified Sea Fury Dreadnought. Powered by the Pratt & Whitney R-4360 Wasp Major which consists of a 28cylinder four-row radial piston engine designed and built during World War II. At 4,362.5 cu in (71.5 L), it is the largestdisplacement aviation piston engine to be mass-produced in the United States, and at 4,300 hp the most powerful. Racers often exceed 500 MPH.

Race 45 of the Formula 1 class. This class allows maximum engine displacement of 200 cubic inches. Aircraft must have a minimum wing area of 66 square feet, and an empty weight of 500 pounds or more. The aircraft must also have fixed landing gear, and a fixed pitch propeller. Racers compete in a 3.19-mile oval course. Aircraft exceed 250 MPH.



Hello to all MVCC Members.

I came across one of the most rarest Gtb's. Well it's a part of the most rarest Gtb's ever made . I now own a 1943 GTB Navy wrecker engine cover with all the original Data plates. If your not familiar with the WW2 Ford GTB Wrecker there were only 50 Wreckers built. All of us that are GTB Burma Jeep enthusiast have always wanted to see and touch a GTB wrecker but we only have a WW2 Wrecker photo to go by . So I called the GTB Guru himself Bob Brown he's 97 years young and sharp as a tack. So I asked him questions on the GTB Wrecker and what I would need to know to build one. Really Bob knew a few things but said there was not much info out there. Also Bob said he was at the Ford plant in 1943, 44 when they were being built. I ask Bob if he knew where I could find an original Marquette 141 power crane used on the wrecker he said he might know of one but it was getting late and he said he needed to get in bed by Midnight crazy old guy. Bob called me back the next day after he thought about it and said Don I'll sell you one of my Marquette cranes which I didn't even know he had one but not only did he have one he had two but would only sell one which I said hell ya I'll take it .

Some of the info Bob gave me that was the Wrecker were built with non consecutive serial number because the Ford GTB Wrecker builders would pull random non winch Gtbc's off the line converted to Wrecker . From the info all wrecker were 1943's and all I can find is one owned by Brian the

Metal Shaper on You Tube which his doesn't have the correct power winch in his 141 Marquette crane and needs a full restoration to make it true and complete . So I'm going to attempt to build a 1943 Tribute GTBB Wrecker with help from Johnny Verissimo and family. I'm working on getting the Marquette crane picked up from Bob in Battle Creek Michigan 2000 miles away. With the crane I will have all the parts I need to start the build. The build starts with a donor GTBS because it's a non winch truck with overload springs , side toolbox , spare tire rack that mount on the bed and dual tires all the Gtbc parts to make it a GTBB . Please stay tuned it will take a little while to get the build started but it will be the only GTBB restored in existence with original GTBB parts .

I am impressed with the quality and price. I had to make brackets to hold the tub to the arms of the rotisserie. This allowed me to not disturb the arms and leave them stock, for future use.

Please notice the bracing. When I first did the bracing I over killed the bracing to the point of not being able to work on the floor. This is all you need.

Photo to the right-Now I can remove the floor etc. and have room to work.

This picture is now known as "The point of no return" If a restoration has high and lows, the first high is picking up the truck.


The last high is driving it the first time completed. The lowest point is when you have dismantled the truck to the point where there is

By as many spot welds as there are, Dodge did not intend for this truck to be restored. Lol The problem is compounded by rust. If the metal is not rusted you can find them pretty easy, however if the surface is distorted by rust you can forget it. Its hunt, find and grind time.









The next installment will be the repairing of the sides, the installation of the new hat channel, and the installation of the trunk and floor into the tub.

Probably will not be the next issue.

The B-24 Liberator Story

The Consolidated B-24 Liberator at the Castle Air Museum in Atwater is an example of American engineering and production. The B-24 was the most numerous American Combat Aircraft produced during the World War II years exceeding over 18,000 aircraft produced. This was one of the production efforts that gave rise to "Rosie the Riveter."

Shortly after war's end however and with the nation wanting to put the war behind it, the B-24 like the tens of thousands of aircraft produced for the war effort were flown to storage airfields such as Kingman Army Airfield Arizona, Walnut Ridge Arkansas as well as several others across the nation. Within 18 months these aircraft were scrapped and smelted into aluminum ingots to manufacture automobiles and durable goods for the burgeoning new era of prosperity.

There were however a few examples which escaped the scrappers torch to survive in other lands to eventually one-day serve as a testimonial to the sacrifice and courage to the men and women who designed, built, maintained and flew these sentinels of democracy into the teeth of hell to preserve a free way of life for generations not yet born. One such example is the B-24 Liberator on exhibit at the Castle Air .Museum in Atwater. It is the only example of its type on the West Coast and one of only approximately 18 known left in existence! This aircraft was constructed by Consolidated Aircraft Company in San Diego in 1945 and with the war winding down and rapid demobilization was declared surplus and found its way to South America where it began hauling cargo over the Andes Mountains.

The B-24 on display has been on outdoor display at the Castle Air Museum now for nearly 33 years. Time exposed to the elements are taking a toll on this grand lady and defender of freedom. Even with ongoing maintenance and painting we can no longer ignore the fact that this magnificent piece of American history must be preserved in order to teach future generations that we cannot ignore and allow our nation to repeat the mistakes of the past! The time is now to join the museum and support the construction of an 80,000 square foot hangar to preserve the B-24 and up to 20 others currently in the elements for posterity! WW2 Ben Hur Trailer

While visiting with a local military vehicle enthusiast last May, he mentioned that a friend of his has a barn full of WW2 trucks that had been rescued from farms around the area for many years. He asked if I would like to go see what he had. Now tell me can anyone turn down an offer like that? So after a phone call was made we were on the road. Sure enough, there were several CCKW's, a WC-63, M7 shop truck, several Jeeps, and one trailer that was little more than a relic. Since I'm not looking for any more trucks, the trailer interested me. What I saw was the skeletal remains of a wood body Ben Hur 1 ton cargo trailer. After some study, I determined that it was mostly complete including many of the usually missing parts like the lunette ring. We struck a deal and agreed that I would pick it up the following weekend.

The next Saturday we met and got it loaded on my flatbed. He asked me what I planned to do with it. I quickly answered "I'll have it restored in 3 months". During the drive home I got to thinking about what I said and kicked myself in the rear end. How could I possibly restore it in 12 weeks?

Once home I got right to it, taking everything off of the frame and placing the parts in carefully labeled containers. I was amazed at just how many nuts and bolts were savable. Very few broke even after having the wood completely deteriorate

out in the weather for decades. But many were missing. I made an inventory of what I would need to purchase and the next Monday made my order at my local fastener wholesale shop.



Next to locate enough oak to do the floor and sides. Craigslist is my friend in times like this. Got some nice wood 30 miles from my house. Took the metal parts to the sandblaster where I had my first pitfall. They dropped the axle and broke both brake drums. Needless to say, they were very sorry. But they made good by not charging me for the sandblasting, paying for replacement drums, and blasting more parts for free.

Primed and painted right away and started assembly of all of the steel parts. Then made my lumber list and got busy planning boards. Had to learn to make tongue-and-groove. Borrowed a router table from a friend. Generated five 55 gallons barrels of sawdust.

In the meantime, I needed to find a pair of tires. No one has them in stock, and all of the suppliers said that maybe in late September they might have some. So the tires were on the back burner for now.

Did opt to put a rubber tire on instead of the steel parking wheel. But the summer heat changed that plan when the inner tube burst and took the little tire with it. Another stumbling block!

Then some luck. I heard of an upcoming estate sale of a long time military vehicle collector and managed to go early to the sale. Bought a parts trailer that had a good steel parking wheel and a few other small bits that I needed. But the real treasure was the pair of unused 7:50x20 NDT tires that were in the back of one of the buildings! I'm now back on track.

Our local club swap meet came and I sourced a set of correct round bezel Corcoran-Brown reflector bezels. Another seller overheard me and offered an original canvas top which I snapped up. Assembly was going well. But many of the step bolts that are used to hold the floor down were too short. So I have to weld on 1 inch extensions to 40 bolts. A tedious task for sure. Ran out of OD paint right near the end so had to get another gallon shipped right away. Thanks Ron! Used about a cup of paint out of that second can.

Now time for stencils and stars. Stars are easy enough, but what registration number to use? There was no data plate on the trailer so I don't really have a place to start. Then I remembered that there was a long piece of wood still laying on my flatbed. I wondered why he had saved it and now I knew. The registration number was on it! And that told me that my trailer was made by the Hercules Trailer Co. in 1943 and it was the 612th trailer that they built.

So on the morning of the 11th week of the project, the stenciling was done. I called the previous owner and asked if he was going to be home in the next hour and that I had something to show him. I loaded up and made the 45 minute drive and boy was he surprised. And I was too. I really didn't think that I could make my 3 month deadline, but things just all came together at the right time.

My Hobby & My 1943 GPW

My name is Damon Viola and I was asked to submit an article on how I got started in the military vehicle genre. I have been involved in the hobby since the late '70s, and early '80s. I became a member of the MVCC and what is now called the MPVA during that time. Most of you know me in some fashion by now after doing this for so long, especially the old-timers. And yes, my interest in military vehicles goes way back to when I was a kid as I used to look at those ads in magazines and imagined what it would be like to own a genuine surplus military Jeep. I was too young to drive at the time but the idea was fun to think about.

Fast forward to the '70s when my interest in such things was rekindled I came across an old beat-up Dodge WC 1/2 ton truck for sale. It wasn't a Jeep but it was cool! It reminded me of when my brother Steve and I, during the summer, would visit the ranch belonging to our relatives in Northern Califor-

nia. There, sitting in the weeds was a 1/2 ton ambulance that we cleaned up the best we could and would play Army in it.


Years later, with those memories in mind, I really wanted this old Dodge that was for sale but I had absolutely no money to buy it. I talked to my brother to see if he might be interested so we went to go look at it. I was a mess - really badly rusted and no bed. The owner lowered the price so my brother said "Okay" and we hauled it home. We didn't know anything about how to fix it up or where to get parts but we somehow managed to make it look presentable, although not very original. The end of that story was my brother sold it after all the work we put into it. I really wanted one of my own that I could keep, but without money I was always out of luck. In about

1980 I met another member of the MVCC who had a lot of old military Dodge stuff lying around and I wound up buying what was left of a 1/2 ton ambulance with the body cut off and missing for \$300.00. I knew I could never make it into an ambulance again but over a few years, I re-invented it to be a cargo truck similar to a 1 1/2 ton Chevrolet G506 in appearance, only smaller in size. I spent many years driving that truck to the meets and back and camping in it for some of

those years. I loved that truck for what it is and have since put over 30,000 miles on it. Over the years I have resisted the temptation to sell when I had no place to store it but somehow I've managed to keep it as part of the family. Even though I don't use it much anymore I could never get rid of my first owned MV.

Then, some years later my friend Lee Edwards approached me to see if I could help him put his Stuart M5 A1 Tank back together. He had it for a long time and started the restoration but over the years it just sat. I told him I'd never worked on tanks before but I would help him with it. It was a several-year project for the both of us but it came out really nice, winning multiple awards along the way. Lee was always on the lookout for military vehicles to buy and sell and one day near the end of the tank project this 1943 GPW Jeep showed up on his property. It sat there for a week or so and I asked what he was going to do with it and he said "sell it", of course. I thought about it for a few days and we made a deal. Now I was back in the restoration



game again, this time for a vehicle I owned! As barn finds go, it was in pretty good shape but still a lot of work to make into how I wanted it. It had the usual rusted-out floors and needed a new back panel among a million other things. The left side rear quarter-panel was from a Willys Jeep that was grafted on at some point in its history so I had to modify it to look like the Ford spec. It did have a good rebuildable GPW engine although not the original. About three years later I had a very nice restored Jeep, with many thanks going out to Lee for helping me with parts and the use of his facility to do the work.

So... what do I have to say about the 40-plus years I have put into this MV hobby? I wouldn't have changed a thing! It's much more than just the interest in one part of military history. It's been a great opportunity to meet and know many wonderful like-minded people along the way. Sadly, when you've been in it as long as I have there is a growing list of those that have since passed, but the memories of them will always live on. I am grateful for all that I have experienced and the people I've know that share this journey with me. Keep Em' Rolling!
