I have been thinking about this since 2016 and I'd like to bring it up since everyone says it behind the curtain but won't say it out loud:

It's weird, it's kind of like **self** -**sabotage**, it's like we purposely want to limit ourselves to growth or continuing the tradition of our hobby. We rarely see a lot of families at our events, I normally don't see new comers, its hard to recruit new people when they are at work and can't attend the event.

- **-The upside to weekends?**. Bigger crowds, more vehicles (because if your gona pay a crazy amount of money in fuel costs to bring your MV to an event you kinda want it to be seen. More venders (because if you are gona spend all the time to load stuff to sell and make a huge display you want to sell some of it). Young Reenactors work on weekdays, so its hard for them to make it. Does anyone have any objection to making new friends and keeping the hobby alive and well.
- -The upside to weekdays? You have to be retired or out of work to attend Camp Plymouth, unless, your boss is really understanding. I know that Christina, your treasurer, has to pull all kinds of strings to get to Plymouth on the weekdays, its not easy for her. On the upside, its less competition for you to buy what you are looking for because there are less people, on the other hand, if you have less people, you might have less venders. Leaving the event early does give some the time to get home before the week starts. There are upsides to driving home on a Sunday. Or you do want to get home by Sunday so you can rest and get ready for the week ahead.

They used to volunteer in the MVCC booth, they are 29 and 27 years old. But now that they have jobs, they can't attend on weekdays. My nephews, who can name every tank used in WW2, one is 13 and one is 10, are major WW2 buffs, they collect 21 Century Models and Soldier of Fortune WW2 models, they have never been to one of our events due to school and their parents work. So I ask myself, is this odd?

ESTHER WILLIAMS, 1940's

A labor of Love, Joyce Schramek

At Eagle Field, in Dos Palos, California, a young girl of 15 clambers out of an oil truck and onto the wings of a plane, swiftly filling its tanks with gas and oil before it roars down the runway, a young Army recruit just learning to fly behind the controls. Her sister, just two years older, sits in the cab, hollering at her younger sibling to hurry so they can fuel the next waiting aircraft. Both young women have put their high school educations on hold to work at the airfield, because if they hadn't, they (and the rest of their family) wouldn't be eating that night.

Born in 1926 in the state of West Virginia, the seventh child of ten, Joyce grew up in the middle of the Great Depression, her childhood spent working alongside her parents and siblings on their Kentuckian farm, so the family might survive. Joyce's father had a job and a decent wage at the local boiler plant but feeding a family of 12 was no easy task. "Everything we ate, we grew!" Joyce says. "We raised a cow for beef, one for milk, chickens for eggs and poultry, and Mother would put up over 100 quarts of fruit every year with her canning. We'd even make syrup from the sap of the trees that surrounded our house."

As the Depression deepened, Joyce's father lost the job that had kept the proverbial wolf from their door, so he struck out to find work, eventually landing in Texas with relatives. It wasn't long after that his wife and children joined him in the Lone Star state, and Joyce remembers fondly a season spent picking cotton alongside her cousins on her uncle's ranch. Though the work was hard, often starting at dawn and ending with the sunset, Joyce smiles fondly at the recollection. "When you have to work to eat, you learn to enjoy it," she quips.



Traveling across the country wasn't easy, in those days. Money for gasoline and food was hard to come by, so frequent stops were made to pick up enough work to get to the next destination. After the cotton season in Texas was over, Joyce and her family continued westward, working in Phoenix for a season before finally arriving in California more than a *year* after their departure. The family would spend the next 4 years working as farm hands on a ranch just outside of Dos Palos, the owner so impressed by the hardworking family that he had a series of cabins built just so they could live together.

Just before Christmas in 1941, the world radically changed when Japan attacked Pearl Harbor and the nation was thrust into the middle of World War II. With most of the men heading off to serve their country, it fell to the daughters, sisters and wives left behind to find work and feed their families. At just 15 years old, Joyce was one of these young women, giving up her high school education to spend her days gassing up the planes at Eagle Field. Once just a small country airfield used by little more than crop dusters, the United States Army took it over in 1942, turning it into a training base where newly-recruited pilots were taught to fly before they headed overseas. "My sister, she drove the truck and I'd hop up on the wings of the plane and fill 'em up. It's so sad we have to have a war to put everyone to work," Joyce remarks.

In 1942, his oldest sons now grown and off fighting, Joyce's father headed north in hopes of finding better work, ultimately landing at the shipyards in Richmond, California. Three of his daughters would join him on the job, the two oldest finding positions as welders, while younger Joyce was hired as a burner. Since girls under the age of 18 weren't permitted to work in the shipyards, Joyce had to lie about her



age, going from 16 to "19" overnight. Dressing daily in head-to-toe protective gear like leather aprons, elbow-length gloves and steel -toed boots, Joyce spent her teens with an acetylene torch in hand, piecing together metal work on the "Liberty" ships—large freighters that carried supplies and ammunition to the fighting men across the sea. When asked about the working conditions in the ship-yard, Joyce just smiles. "When you've been working all your life, it wasn't really that big of a deal. And it was good money, the most I'd ever made."

When the war ended in 1945 and there was no longer the need for ships (or those who built them), the sisters were summarily dismissed from their positions and sent on their way. The family was lucky enough to relocate to a suitable plot of land just outside Stockton, and it was just a short while later that Joyce would meet the man she'd marry. "I was working up at Camp Beale and I'd already made up my mind I would never date any of the young men there. They'd all just come back from the war, and I knew that *any* girl was looking pretty good to them by then," Joyce chuckles.

Five of Joyce's brothers served in the army forces during the war. Joyce is a real life Rosie the Riveter!

SS Jeremiah O'Brien Liberty Ship 80th Birthday Cruise and MV Display Update Event Will be Rescheduled or Cancelled

I wrote an article in the last newsletter about this MV display and Bay cruise in San Francisco so I won't repeat it all here. It turns out their scheduled visit to the Mare Island drydock for maintenance has been pushed back to August, so the weekend of the 19th is out. They won't do it in July because of an event in the Pier 35 building and September is too close to Fleet Week. They are considering inviting our display on Fleet Week weekend, October 7-8, 2023. They do bay cruises both days and are out there during the air show which will include the Blue Angels. The air show is also Friday as is the Parade of Ships.

They are checking with the Navy about the use of the pier building for O'Brien volunteer parking plus our display and tow vehicle parking. If all this works out and we receive cruise boarding passes for MV participation, it will likely be for Sunday, not Saturday because they normally sell out on Saturday. It would be lost revenue to include us then.

Having a free parking place during Fleet Week weekend not far from air show center and all the shopping and dining places would be a rare treat.

The "Mystery can" has a name, by Robin and Carol Bartel

Collectors have been calling this can "experimental" or "mystery can" for many years. Officially to the US Army it was known as Can, Gasoline, 5-Gallon, Model DHC-42.


US Army officer Letcher O. Grice submitted his design to the US Patent Office on 13 March, 1942. It essentially was a cam-lock lid replacing the then standard screw on cap that the 5 gallon fuel

container (universally known as the Jerry Can) used. His design was utilized exclusively by the Monarch Company, having the new lids manufactured by the McCord Radiator Com-


On 13 April 1942, 100 such cans were submitted by the Desert Warfare Board, to Headquarters 207th Quartermaster Battalion Gasoline Supply at Camp Young, California, to be field tested. The test consisted of filling and emptying the cans during daylight and blackout conditions, cross country hauling for 15 hours, and normal motor pool operations over a period of two weeks. The results were mixed and several deficiencies were found, i.e. the cap's gasket was easily lost and fuel tended to vent violently when the cam was lifted. The 207th OMGS recommended that the can not be adopted. However the Desert Warfare Board did recommend its adoption if the problems could be corrected. Apparently the problems did get fixed as 69,000 cans were made during the Dura-

> tion. The new cap received US Patent Number 2365695 on 26 December 1944.

Examples exist dated 1942 and 1943, and some of the caps have the trade name McCORD stamped in them while others do not. The can's opening is threaded inside to accept the early WW2 brass fuel can nozzle, yet it will also accept the cam lever nozzle. During the research for this article I could not find what
